### A HISTORIC BREAKFAST

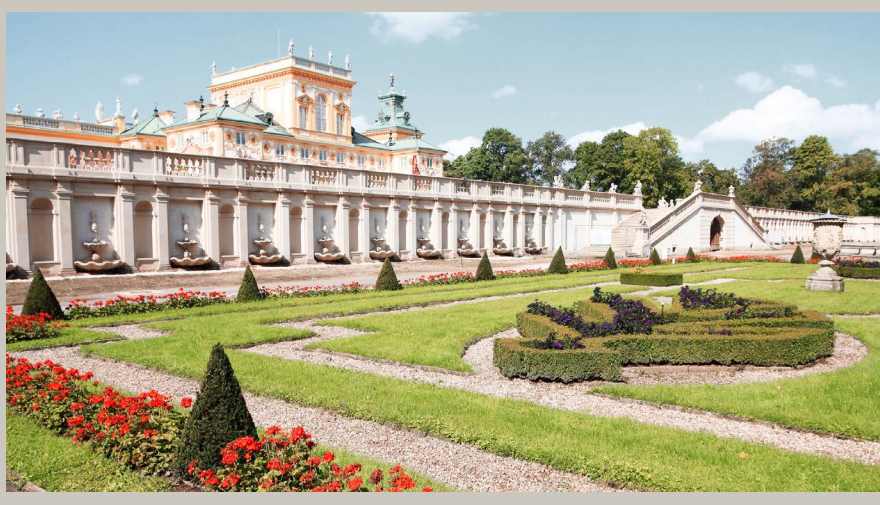
One of Warsaw's most luxurious breakfasts is to be found at Café Bristol, where also on the menu is an astonishing view of the city's historical centre. It's as famous for its opulent interior as it for its delicious, freshly baked pastries, aromatic coffee and hot chocolate.

### A FEAST TO LAST FOREVER

Magda Gessler is one of Poland's most famous restaurateurs, and AleGloria offers a contemporary taste of Poland, in a series of individually decorated basement rooms each offering a different and memorable ambience.

### TRADITIONAL POLISH FARE

Folk Gospoda (the Folk Inn) is one of Warsaw's oldest restaurants, dating back to the 17th century, and steeped in legend. It's a family restaurant, where generations come to share traditional Polish meals and folk music.



## A SIGHT TO BEHOLD

### AN UNUSUAL OASIS

On top of the University of Warsaw Library is one of Europe's largest and most beautiful roof gardens. With its interconnected levels, pond and stream it's an extraordinary place to unwind, and offers far-reaching views across the Old Town and the river.

### WARSAW'S BAROQUE GEM

The breathtaking Wilanow Palace is one of Warsaw's highlights, and not to be missed. It houses several museums and galleries, including the macabre-sounding Gallery of Coffin Portraits. Take restorative stroll around the spectacular Italian Garden.

### AN EXTRAORDINARY SURVIVOR

Along with most of Warsaw's Old Town, the Castle was completely rebuilt after the Second World War, but that's just part of its long and fascinating history. Enhancing the permanent exhibits is a programme of exhibitions and concerts.

### GIFTS OF DISTINCTION

Polish ceramics make gorgeous gifts or keepsakes, and Bolesławiec is one of the oldest companies in the region. Find lovely kitchenware, dinner sets, decorative items and jewellery, painted in the distinctive regional style.

### TAKE HOME SOMETHING DIFFERENT

On weekends, Koło Bazar is a magnet for Poland's collectors of the unusual, the old and the odd. From period furniture to stamps, war memorabilia and pre-war posters, if it's been languishing in an attic or basement it will probably end up here.

Galeria Mokotów has over 62,000 square metres of shopping space, and is home to just about every international clothing, sports and beauty brand - from high street to high-end – that you can think of.
